Integration through Civic Engagement. Social work with Refugees: Chances and Challenges

Many refugees who have escaped to Germany within the last months will probably stay there for a long time. Therefore, the current discourse on refugee policies is not only dominated by issues of humanitarian assistance – but also by the question on how to tie this humanitarian assistance into long-term civic involvement and solidarity. New approaches of social participation and social cohesion are coming to the fore: How can these displaced people with all their qualifications, competences, interests, needs and aspirations become actively involved in German society? How can we counteract racism and rightwing extremism which are increasingly reported of in some places? And how can we secure plurality and solidarity in our municipalities?

Here civic involvement plays a major role: Without the sheer size of the contributions of volunteerism, neither the immediate support of the newly arrived people in Europe nor their comprehensive long-term integration could be successful. Not only volunteers but also refugees are socially and politically involved in many various ways, and contribute actively to social developments.

Professional social workers play a crucial role in coordinating, accompanying, teaching and qualifying people voluntary engaged in the field of refugee work. However, in the field of Social Work with refugees, social workers sometimes act under hard conditions themselves, and they are particularly challenged to clarify their own position.

Against this background, this symposium will focus on the interface between volunteer civic involvement and professional Social Work. In order to discuss the related issues from many different perspectives, civil society actors, social workers, scientists and guests from administration, industry, associations, media and politics will be invited.
