

TOUR 1:

Wallraf-Richartz-Museum & Fondation Corboud

Obenmarspforten Am Kölner Rathaus D-50667, Köln

The Wallraf-Richartz-Museum & Fondation Corboud houses a collection of mediaeval paintings, as well as works by the Baroque masters, ranging from Rubens and Rembrandt to Murillo and Boucher, the German Romantics, French Realism, and Impressionism. Another Room presents works from the museums rich collection of master drawings, by artists ranging from Leonardo da Vinci to Albrecht Dürer, Rubens, Max Liebermann, Auguste Rodin, and many more. The museum's restorers are researching the objects in the collection, for example there was an exhibition on the painting technique of medieval artists and impressionists.

Rautenstrauch-Joest-Museum Cäcilienstraße 29-33 50667 Köln

> The Rautenstrauch-Joest-Museum houses ethnological objects from cultures all over the world and of diverse materials. The museum collection was transferred to a new building in 2017, which confronted the house's restorers with a major task.

TOUR 3:

Kölner Dom - Cologne Cathedral

Domkloster 4,

50667 Köln

(Right next to the Cologne Main Station - Köln Hbf)

"It can be seen from nearly every point in the city centre and from many places elsewhere: The magnificent Cologne Cathedral hovers above the roofs and chimneys of the city. It is not only used as a point of orientation but is the pride of the people in Cologne. The panorama of the city has been dominated by the Cathedral's gigantic pair of towers (the North Tower (157.38 m) is 7 cm higher than the South Tower) since their completion in 1880."

TOUR 4:

Kapitolstüren - The wooden doors in the church St. Maria im Kapitol Kasinostraße 6, 50676 Köln

During her research semester, Dr. Regina Urbanek mainly researched romanesque objects, with the wooden door in St. Maria im Kapitol in Cologne, dating from around 1060, at the centre of her research. The research focused on Romanesque colour versions, the Romanesque reconstruction phase and the preparation of the results for transdisciplinary research approaches.

The Museum Ludwig collection comprises important works of 20th and 21st century art with the most comprehensive pop art collection in Europe, the third largest Picasso collection in the world, one of the most significant collections on German Expressionism, outstanding works by the Russian Avant Garde and an excellent collection on the history of photography.
